 of developing metrics related to patient referrals, screenings, legal services provided, and
 patient outcomes;
- Participate in resource development, including management of grants, and, as necessary, work with HHC and CLS to identify and pursue grants and other funding opportunities;

- Work towards achieving full integration of legal staff into healthcare team through consistent contact, communication and collaboration to advance patient health, using a team-based approach.
